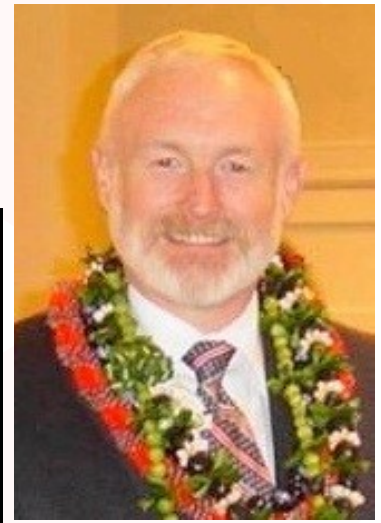




Wednesday, 21 September 11 NCMA Aloha Chapter Luncheon Announcement



Mr. Douglas Murdock, Colonel (Ret), USAF, Of Counsel, Alston Hunt Floyd & Ing, Labor Employment and Government Contracts Group Presenting “How to Survive a Crisis: Lesson Learned from Acquisition and Ethics Scandals” During his career, he worked on numerous high-profile cases in the Pentagon and in the field, including the Darlene Druyun/Boeing Tanker Lease crisis.

Doug Murdock is currently in private practice focusing in government contracts, ethics and procurement integrity at Alston Hunt Floyd & Ing in Honolulu, Hawai'i. He holds a Juris Doctorate from the University of Washington, and also has degrees in Public Administration and Economics. He is licensed to practice law in Hawaii, Washington state and before the United States Supreme Court. In his last military assignment, Colonel Murdock was Staff Judge Advocate and Ethics Counselor for Electronic Systems Center at Hanscom AFB, MA. ESC's mission is to acquire command and control, intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance systems for the Air Force. ESC manages more than \$3 billion in programs annually. Colonel Murdock led a team of 50 legal professionals providing counsel to the 3-star Center Commander and 5 Wing Commanders on all aspects of systems acquisitions and military law.
